ACCREDITATION MANAGER TRAINING

About the Training:

The Arizona Law Enforcement Accreditation Program (ALEAP) follows a progressive and time-proven method of assisting law enforcement agencies with measuring and improving their overall performance. Participating agencies conduct a thorough self-assessment to determine how existing operations can be adapted to meet a set of Best Practices in the efficient and effective delivery of law enforcement services. When these practices are in place, a team of trained assessors verifies that applicable standards have been successfully implemented.

The first step in the process is the appointment of the agency Accreditation Manager (AM). The new Accreditation Manager needs specialized training to develop skills important to the agency's success in the accreditation process.

This training will familiarize the new AM in the following areas: History of law enforcement accreditation, Benefits and goals of accreditation, Overview of the Arizona Law Enforcement Accreditation Program (ALEAP), Arizona Standards, Proofs of Compliance, Creating Files, Mock Assessments, as well as the ALEAP on-site assessment and maintaining compliance.

This training will provide a forum for asking questions, as well as meeting others being appointed to the AM position, creating a peer-to-peer network. Newly appointed AM's are encouraged to attend this beneficial session prior to starting the accreditation process. Experienced AM's are welcome to share their experiences with running an accreditation process. We urge all personnel, at any level, that are anticipated to be involved in the accreditation process to attend this **FREE** training.
